

COMPUTING WITH ECAS – flexible facilities to suit all
– with specialist equipment for those with disabilities
– and also software to help search for grants

Following the introduction of our **FREE** internet café Ecas can now offer those with a physical disability a variety of ways to access computing and the internet:

- Classes with a highly qualified tutor on Tuesdays. Although there is a charge of £4 for 2 hours or £6 for 3 hours, this includes transport from Ecas back home and there is no charge for those who meet certain criteria – phone 0131 475 2344 for details.
- For those who do not need instruction, a free internet café on Wednesdays from 10am to 4pm and on Thursday afternoons.

Our computing equipment includes specialist aids for those with physical disabilities and we have also installed specialist software to help people search for grants.



Greg Haddow, Ecas Computing Group Leader, said: “Our computing classes have always been very popular and have recently been growing in size. Many of the students had been expressing an interest in the internet and developing their skills in this area. Our internet café will cater for those with varying needs and we have a range of equipment including scanners, printers and assorted mouse devices for all abilities.”

Ecas also run a variety of other classes from art, calligraphy and craft to yoga and swimming for physically disabled people.
